What is this class all about?
AP World History is a college level course designed to be a challenging overview that focuses on the evolution interaction, and common threads found in human societies over time. This course is very SKILLS oriented to offer students an opportunity to develop their analytical abilities and critical thinking skills to understand historical and geographical context, make comparisons across cultures, use documents and other primary sources, and recognize and discuss different interpretations and historical frameworks. This course imposes a heavy reading and writing load that will help measure student understanding of both content and skills. Students must pass this course AND take the AP World History Exam to earn a verified credit

## I should take this class if I can....

Demonstrate a passion for history (do you read historical novels, history books, the newspaper regularly?)
, Communicate ideas clearly in writing (do you know the difference between a thesis statement for history \& English?)
Work well at an accelerated pace (do you thrive in stressful situations and timed assessments?)
, Produce your highest quality work each week (do you consistently give your best effort?)
$\checkmark$ Actively engage in discussion and support ideas with evidence (do you consistently cite sources and make connections between the past and the present??
$\checkmark$ Work collaboratively on projects (do you work well in a team setting?)
